In order to help promote our own Drake Relays, we must get our top-flight competitors into national competition every chance possible. Consequently, this makes for an outstanding varsity and freshman track schedule. We have an attractive scholarship program and can give a substantial amount of financial assistance to athletes who qualify.

Drake has an outstanding reputation in the area of academics with particular emphasis on liberal arts, education, business administration, pharmacy, journalism, pre-engineering, pre-law, pre-med, and pre-dent. Our admission requirements are that you must be in the upper-half of your graduating class and that you have a composite test score on the

DRAKE UNIVERSITY TRACK PROGRAM

Enrollment:

Approximately 4,500 students; school colors - blue and white

Stadium:

A track stadium with sunken infield for better viewing; horse-shoe shaped with north end open - home of DRAKE RELAYS

Fieldhouse:

With indoor track of clay surface for home meets and practices

Track Conferences:

Missouri Valley Conference; Central Collegiate - fully accredited with North Central and N.C.A.A.

Relays Director:

Track and cross-country coach; Bob Karnes - 1950 U. of Kansas graduate; K.U. cross-country captain for three years; K.U. track captain for two years - winner of 13 Big 7 Conference (now Big 8) Titles in cross-country, mile, 2-miles; Twice winner of "outstanding track athlete in Conference", - has coached at Drake 10 years, winning teams in mile, 2-mile, and sprint medley relays in many major relay meets; 1962, 63-64 Missouri Valley Conference champs cross-country; 1963-64-65 Missouri Valley Conference outdoor track title.

Varsity Competition:

All major and national track meets and relay carnivals. Duals with major schools in the area.

Frosh Competition:

Dual meets in cross-country, indoor track and outdoor track with other frosh teams and with smaller college varsity squads. Usually outstanding frosh sent to AAU meets in Chicago area and other near-by large meets. Frosh have participated in Ohio State Relays, Chicago Relays, Texas Relays, Kansas Relays, and Houston "Meet of Champions". (Frosh do not compete as members of varsity teams.)

Academic Schools at Drake University:

Business Administration, Divinity, Education, Fine Arts, Law, Liberal Arts, and Pharmacy, (Pre-med, Pre-dent, Preengineering)

Drake Offers:

Major academic programs - classes are kept small to afford personal attention to sudents. Track squads are kept small for personal attention to athletes. Aim is not for outstanding dual team, but for individual and relay teams to enter in national meets.

Scholarships:

Full and part scholarships are available to outstanding athletes and students. High School grades are important. Should be in upper-half of graduating class and have taken ACT, (composite score needed - 21)
